Synopsis:

Drafting a divorce petition can be tricky and one could always be puzzled as to how much information is sufficient. This webinar deals with the practical aspects of drafting a divorce petition.

The topics that will be dealt with during this seminar are:-

- 1) pre-conditions to a divorce petition being filed
- 2) the breakdown of marriage
- 3) children's issues
- 4) maintenance
- 5) division of property; and
- 6) naming the third party

Participants will be guided on how to draw up a proper order so that it would withstand a committal proceeding, successfully. Contempt is easier to raise when an order is properly drawn up. Participants will also be guided on the step-by-step methods of preparing for committal proceedings and a session on case studies that will give the participants a real experience of drafting.

He has authored several books, the latest being Malaysian Civil Procedure and Practice published by CLJ Publication.
