SUMMARY

A new way of being a lawyer is what Collaborative Practice is all about. Can lawyers be peacemakers? Are you intrigued by the notion of having a practice where the Collaborative approach and a peace-making mindset infuse your entire practice?

Her practice straddles all three areas of Litigation, Collaborative Practice and Mediation. As an experienced litigator she has been involved in many areas of practice including Contentious Matrimonial matters and Cross Borders Custody Disputes, Employment Disputes, Corporate and Commercial Disputes and Medical Negligence, Probate and Estate matters.

She was one of the pioneers in Malaysia who underwent collaborative training with International Academy of Collaborative Professionals (IACP), an international community of legal, mental health and financial professionals working in concert to create client-centered processes for resolving conflict. She serves on the Malaysian Bar Family Law Committee (FLC) and is the Co-Deputy Chair of FLC. On the Alternate Dispute Resolution (ADR) front she is the current head of the Collaborative Practice Subcommittee of the FLC. As a trained collaborative professional who is keen to encourage Collaborative Practice as an Alternative Dispute Resolution option in family matters, Rajashree is now proudly serving as the Co-Group Leader of the Malaysian Collaborative Practice Group (MCPG). MCPG stands as an IACP Global Partner since 2021. She also serves on the Diversity Equality and Inclusion Committee of IACP. She is also a trainer for the Bar Advocacy Training Course.

Upon undertaking facilitative mediation training under the auspices of the Malaysian Bar and Malaysian Mediation Centre, she is also listed as an accredited mediator on the panel of the Bar Council Malaysian International Mediation Centre. She also served as a member of the FLC Mediation Sub-committee for the past 2 terms and also serving in the current term of 2023/2024. To expand her skills and ability in skillful mediation, she has also undergone training in Insight Mediation conducted by Innovation for Lawyers Inc, Canadian trainers using the Insight Approach. Currently she is undergoing a further 1-year course which delves deeply into Insight Approach to help mediate cases and disputes of ruptured relationships effectively.



For seamless streaming, download the Zoom app.

Log in to Zoom, and provide your username.

For Members of the Bar or pupils in chambers, use the format below for identification purposes when prompted: Full name (as per NRIC) | Bar Council membership number or petition number.

For non-Members, provide your full name only.

Set up your space.

Find a spot which is comfortable and free from background noises. You may use an earpiece with microphone for clarity. Having a strong internet connection is equally important.
