Speakers:

Honey Tan Lay Ean practices high conflict matrimonial law. Her clients comprise Malaysians and foreigners. She has dealt with parental child abduction. Common features of her cases involve parental alienation, disputes over division of matrimonial assets and contentious claims for maintenance for wives and children. Honey obtained her LLM from Warwick University, and is a member of The Honorable Society of the Middle Temple. She serves in the Malaysian Bar Council where she is the Co-Chairperson of the Family Law Committee.

Goh Siu Lin graduated from the University of Bristol, England and has been called to the English and Malaysian Bar. She has an active practice with emphasis on banking litigation, probate, adoptions and matrimonial disputes with an international jurisdictional-flavour. She has held watching briefs for the Joint Action Group for Gender Equality (“JAG”) in several landmark cases involving interfaith conversion custodial disputes, citizenship for stateless children, and a domestic violence murder trial. She advocates and lobbies for law reform on child and family legislation. Siu Lin regularly writes for the IBA Family Law News newsletter and is a contributing editor on Order 72 (Contentious Probate Proceedings) of the Malaysian Civil Procedure. She is the Co-Deputy Chairperson of the Child Rights Committee of the Bar Council.
